<p><u>GLOBAL DIMENSION</u></p>	<p>This term, children will be learning about different cultures and countries through their work in History, Literacy, Art, ICT and R.E.</p>
<p><u>SCIENCE</u></p> <p>Properties and changes of materials</p> <p>Water Cycle</p> <p>Space</p>	<p>Compare and group everyday materials on the basis of their properties. Know that some materials dissolve in a liquid to form a solution. Use knowledge of solids, liquids and gases.</p> <p>Investigate changes of state, focusing on evaporation and condensation. Understand how this relates to the water cycle.</p> <p>Describe the movement of the Earth and other planets, relative to the sun in the solar system. Describe the movements of the Moon relative to the Earth. Describe the Sun, Earth and Moon as approximately spherical bodies. Use the idea of the Earth's rotation to explain day and night and the apparent movement of the sun across the sky.</p>
