School Value for the Term: Teamwork

This week we have had assessment week in Year 3 to 5. This will give teachers a baseline of what the children can do and what the children need support with. We are using a new assessment system this year, PIXL, this is so we can be more forensic in our approach to teaching, learning and assessment. This is a key part of our school improvement plan this year. The system also allows us to compare with cohorts around the country using this system. Our Year 6's started this process in September and the results have been received this week. We were able to compare ourselves with 494 other schools and we are very similar to other cohorts around the country – with our Year 6 cohort being above in reading and significantly above in arithmetic. Teachers will be able to share results with parents at parent consultations after half term.

Nursery children have also been on a nature walk with staff and family members this week. It was a pleasure to accompany them and see the awe and wonder in their eyes as they discovered different autumn offerings. They also enjoyed splashing in the muddy puddles! There will be two further walks with the remaining children in the coming weeks and I hope to accompany them again. Thank you to the Emmanuel Church for providing the end spot and providing squash and biscuits.

Year 6 have had a fantastic time at Woodlands and return home today. Many thanks to staff who have given up their time to make this trip happen. More information about their adventures will appear in next week's newsletter.

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Governor News

At its meeting on Thursday 28 September, the Governing Body approved a refreshed vision, aims and values statement for the school. The updated wording is now available on the school website.

The Governors are currently leading the development of a new 3-year school strategy which is due to be finalised by the 2024 spring term. As a first step towards this, they revisited the school's mission and aims.

Governors agreed that the message and intention of the original wording was strong and should be retained but that it could be expressed in a shorter and clearer way. It was also important to Governors that the school values reflected recent input from pupils which has now been added in and that the school's motto "Be the best you can be" overarch the whole statement.

Interim Chair of Governors, Alastair Deacon said: "The refreshed statement is very much a recommitment to everything Bure Park Primary School is and stands for, which is why it is really important we state it clearly and in a way that resonates. The Governing Body wants this to be central to our emerging new strategy and lived out in every aspect of school life at Bure Park Primary".

The refreshed wording includes the vision:

"To educate all Bure Park Primary pupils to the highest levels of their academic ability, enabling them to reach and extend their potential and preparing them to become responsible, respectful, inclusive, creative, and compassionate members of society." full statement can be found on the school website here
