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




#### Makaton Sign of the Week

Last week two teams went to the Bicester Cluster Schools Hockey Tournament at the Cooper School. Both teams played extremely well- especially as most children had never played a hockey match before.

One team managed to win the competition and yesterday went to the North Oxfordshire Schools Final, also held at Cooper School. Although the games were tougher, everybody played brilliantly with some amazing defending, passing and determination to score goals. Above all the children showed great sportsmanship and fair play, with Captain Ella finishing each game with three cheers for the opposition.

The Bure Park team won their first three games convincingly and had to face Deddington in their final game (Deddington had also won all of their games!) Bure Park took the lead part way into the second half and were close to winning but Deddington came back in the last few minutes to equalise. The final score was 1-1 and both Deddington and Bure Park finished on equal points overall, leaving the final placings down to goal difference (which Deddington won). Although this meant Bure Park finished the day in second place, both schools will now go on to the Oxfordshire School Games Final, which is to be held at Radley College in Abingdon next week.

All childcare is invoiced in advance and can be paid via <u>ScoPay</u> or Childcare Voucher Schemes. We do not accept Cash or Cheques.

You pay for the sessions regardless of whether your child attends or not. We also require a <u>terms</u> notice for cancellation of your childcare or a reduction in your sessions.
