Welcome back to term 5 – I cannot believe how fast the year is going! The children came back into school and settled into their learning very quickly with Year 3 and 4 both having topic days to start the term – Year 3 Celts and Year 4 rainforests. Year 2 have been to Selly Manor and the Nursery had a spring walk. Our Arts Ambassadors have had a flag making workshop with a local artist. It has been a busy week!

This term we are trialling blocking the wider curriculum areas in the afternoons, such as science, history and geography. This has worked very successfully in Year 1 this year and we have found that its improved knowledge and engagement.

#### Thomas Trip to Milan

Thomas in Year 4 has had an amazing opportunity to play football in a tournament in Italy. He has written the following report to share his experience. Well done Thomas!

During the Easter holiday I flew to Milan, Italy with my Junior Premier League football team, Oxfordshire Regional Team Centre (RTC) to play in an international tournament called the Yes Cup. There were 18 different countries including USA, Australia, India and Romania taking part and we were in the U10 category in a group with a team from Italy and 2 teams from Serbia.

After leaving Heathrow on Thursday we headed straight to the venue for the Opening ceremony which was broadcast live on YouTube and a great chance for all the players to meet each other. The Friday was the first day of football. Our first match was against the Italian team Pro Patria. We only had 5 players so for all the games we had to "borrow" 3 Italian players from a different team. This was difficult as none of them spoke English and none of us spoke Italian but we made it work! The first game we were off to a flying start and won the game 6-4. Our second game this day was against FK Olimpik Beograd from Serbia. This was a tough game against a tough group of boys and quite a physical match and unfortunately, we lost 1-11.

Saturday started with another match against the other Serbian team FK Novante B, again this was a very strong team and we again lost, this time 1-6. Saturday afternoon was an opportunity for all of us and our families to head into Milan and do some sightseeing. After a bit of shopping and some food all of the RTC players ended the night dancing in the middle of Piazza del Duomo with a silly Italian man!

Sunday was the final day of the tournament. The weather was horrible and raining more than it does in the UK! We were in the play off for 11th /12th position against another Italian team, Zibido San Giacomo. With the rain pouring down it was clear the Italian players were not used to playing in this type of weather as they were all shivering and trying to avoid the puddles on the pitch, whilst we all had great fun getting as wet as we could! It was in this match that I scored my first international goal as an England player, a shot from outside the box straight into the top left of the goal! The energy was high amongst the team and we won the game 6-1! All of the team had scored at some point across the weekend so it was a fantastic feeling amongst all the boys. We finished the tournament 11th out of 16 teams, which wasn't bad seeing as we couldn't communicate with all of our team mates!

A fantastic weekend, meeting new people and learning some new Italian words too! We have a few weeks of our league season left before we start preparing for our next tour to Holland for the Maastricht Cup in June!
